Ben Petty, the seminarian who was assigned to St. Bart's this summer, will be returning to Rome soon to continue his studies. Parishioners wish to thank him for leading a group discussion on Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, *Rejoice and be Glad*. Over the 3 weekly sessions, he digested the text and instilled in the group the Jesuit motto, "For the Greater Glory of God." This past weekend, Ben also gave interested parishioners a virtual tour of the excavations which revealed the original tomb of Peter underneath St. Peter's Basilica, where he has worked as an official guide. Others in the community met Ben after week-day or weekend Masses or heard him lifting his voice in song during the liturgy. Ben mentioned that he will be drawn to a social outreach activity in SE Washington, DC before he departs. We all wish him well in his studies and future assignments.
