The **Poor Box** for the month of **October** is for Montgomery Hospice, a non profit hospice serving residents of Montgomery County, MD - its team of doctors, nurses, social workers, and spiritual and bereavement counselors work with patients and their families to provide quality end-of-life care in homes, extended care facilities, and at Casey House, their acute care facility.

This weekend, October 17/18, we will celebrate **World Mission Sunday**. Pope Francis invites the entire Church to support mission dioceses in Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe, where priests, religious and lay leaders serve the world's most vulnerable communities. Please keep the Pope's missions in your prayers and be generous in this week's collection for the **Society for the Propagation of the Faith**.

We continue to collect food for St. Martin's Pantry in Gaithersburg (as we do year-round) with a group of volunteers delivering food weekly. They particularly request (listed in order of need as of October 5): canned soup, pasta sauce, "add-ins" (cookies, crackers, etc.), pasta, canned fruit, canned vegetables, "meals in a can" (stew/canned pasta/chili/etc.), dry unsweetened cereal, peanut butter and jelly, Ensure for adults and PediaSure for children are both requested and continue to be in short supply. Baby formula, especially Similac Blue and baby food #2 are out completely. Diapers Nos. 2 and 3 are currently in short supply. The Pantry team is very pleased to have a multiple week supply of plastic and paper bags but they are still very happy to take any of the larger-size paper bags such as the approx. 16.5 inch by one foot by seven inch bags used by Trader Joe's which are especially useful. (Handles not necessary.) The plastic bags that are useful can be found at Costco on the non-food side of the store and are known as "Tee Shirt" bags, and are sold in a brown box, about 40 to a box, as well as (empty) plastic newspaper bags which they fill with any food items that fit. Please kindly leave your non-perishable food items in the marked basket in the vestibule. Thank you.
