***Why I Choose to Remain Catholic" - Perspective of a Scripture Scholar and Former Protestant Minister***

**Wednesday, November 7 at 7pm in the Church Hall**

Dr. John Bergsma is Professor of Theology at the Franciscan University of Steubenville. A former Protestant pastor, Dr. Bergsma entered the Catholic Church in 2001 while getting his Ph.D. in Scripture from the University of Notre Dame. A close collaborator of Dr. Scott Hahn, Bergsma speaks regularly on Catholic radio and at conferences and parishes nationally and internationally. He has authored seven books on Scripture and the Catholic faith, including *Bible Basics for Catholics* (Ave Maria Press), *Stunned by Scripture: How the Bible Made Me Catholic* (Our Sunday Visitor), and *A Catholic Introduction to the Bible: Old Testament* (with Brant Pitre; Ignatius Press). Dr. Bergsma's talks and studies are available on CD and mp3 from [catholicproductions.com](http://catholicproductions.com). He and his wife Dawn reside with their eight children in Steubenville, Ohio.

As a quick reminder –

Basketball has divisions based on age (no longer grade level) and gender and works as follows:

- 18U – Anyone who is 18 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Boys + Girls Teams). These teams may include any girls in high school because there is no 16U team.
- 16U – Anyone who is 16 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Only Boys Team).
- 14U – Anyone who is 14 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Boys + Girls Teams). Typically this includes 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders.
- 12U – Those who are 12 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Boys + Girls Teams). Typically this includes 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders.
- 10U – Those who are 10 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Boys + Girls Teams). Typically this includes 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders.

For those in Kindergarten and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade, we will have an intramural program similar to last year at the school and will be held in the gym on Saturday mornings beginning in January.

## VIGESIMONOVENO DOMINGO ORDINARIO 21 DE OCTUBRE 2018

Santiago y Juan se acercan a Jesús con una petición extraña: ocupar los puestos de honor junto a él. «No saben lo que piden». Así les dice Jesús. No han entendido nada de su proyecto al servicio del reino de Dios y su justicia. No piensan en «seguirle», sino en «sentarse» en los primeros puestos. Al ver su postura, los otros diez se indignan. También ellos alimentan sueños ambiciosos. Todos buscan obtener algún poder, honor o prestigio. El pensamiento de Jesús es claro. «No ha de ser así entre ustedes». Hay que ir exactamente en la dirección opuesta. El verdadero modelo es Jesús: no gobierna, no impone, no domina ni controla. No ambiciona ningún poder. No busca su propio interés. Lo suyo es «servir» y «dar la vida». Por eso es el primero y más grande. El poder y la grandeza es el registro de dominio entre las naciones, pero no en el reino de la gloria del Mesías. “No ha de ser así entre ustedes” El reino de Dios es de otro tipo, es un reino de gloria, humillación y fuerza. Los convocados en el nombre de Jesús, la Iglesia, se relacionan con criterios de servicio y simplicidad.

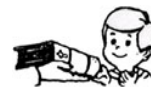
