TRIGESIMOSEGUNDO DOMINGO ORDINARIO 11 DE NOVIEMBRE 2018

Si en cualquier momento y cultura ser viuda es símbolo de soledad y vacío, la viuda del Evangelio de este domingo se nos revela como sumamente pobre. Frente a ella están los ricos echando abundantemente en la bandeja del Templo, pasando aparentemente desapercibidos para la aguda mirada de Jesús. Pero, de repente, entre las espléndidas limosnas, “dos reales”, tintinearón con un sonido especial. Era el don de la viuda, que, al echarlos en la bandeja del Templo en el que creía y confiaba, se quedó sin nada. Y algo sonó en el corazón de Jesús. Quiso que el impacto que había causado en él aquella viuda lo captasen los suyos, para que jamás olvidaran lo que, a los ojos de Dios, era verdaderamente importante. “Os aseguro -les dice a los discípulos- que esa pobre viuda ha echado más que nadie... porque ha echado todo lo que tenía para vivir”. El mensaje de hoy nos enseña *que para llegar al corazón de Dios sólo hace falta dar cuanto se tiene, creer en sus promesas sin reservarse nada, poner la vida “en la bandeja” y esperar confiadamente en el milagro de que El hará que no se acabe nunca la esperanza.*

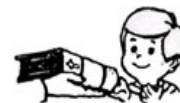
